Can you remember your favorite childhood toy? Mine was a fishing game. My little sister Jeannie and I played with it with our dear friend Theresa Barnick. She was our 75-year-old neighbor and "third Grandma".

The game pieces were simple. There were 10 or 12 small wooden fish with each a tiny eye hook on top of each and 2 wooden fishing rods that each had string connected to a small hook. The goal was to "catch" fish by getting the hook into the eyehook on top of the fish. There were no rules, we never kept score and there were no winners or losers.
